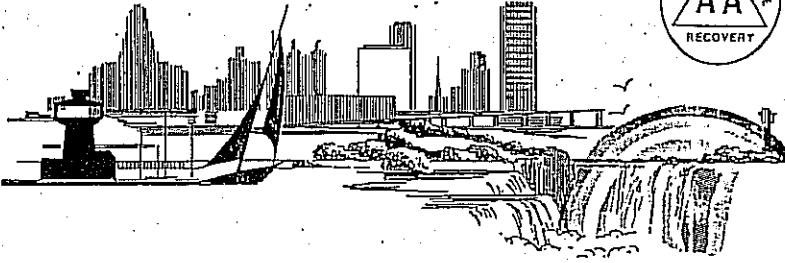

After the publication of Jack Alexander's article in the "Saturday Evening Post," in 1941 entitled "Freed Slaves of Drink, Now They Free Others," four alcoholics in the city of Buffalo wrote AA's Central Office. Helen Hock, the secretary then, drafted hand-written responses for their inquires, (apparently AA didn't have a typewriter in those early days in New York.) These people were referred to visit the Family Services Society located somewhere on Elmwood Avenue near Bidwell Parkway.

In the early days, AA asked the Family Services Society to use their resources to interpret the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous. The early members of AA believed the professional psychiatric community was best suited to understand the principles required to bring about the complete psychic change so vital to recovery from alcoholism. The Family Services Society, in turn, contracted the services of a certain psychiatrist, a Dr. Samuel Y., paying him a handsome fee to conduct therapy classes for alcoholics using the AA Big Book. There were four people in Buffalo, Bob C., Al. P. Adrian A., and another unidentified alcoholic, who received information from this doctor on how to stay sober.

In the article that was written in the "Saturday Evening Post," it was stated that there were no dues or fees for membership in AA, and it seemed that Dr. Y. was charging for his therapy classes anywhere from \$5 to \$10 a session. Bob C.'s wife wrote a letter to AA's New York office complaining bitterly that AA was a fraud because her husband was being charged \$10 a night.

That letter was sent immediately to the co-founder of AA, Dr. Bob S., in Akron, Ohio. Dr. Bob contacted a member in Cleveland, Ohio named Arnie C. It seems that Arnie, who was sober a couple of months, was being transferred to the city of Buffalo by his company. Arnie was frightened at the prospect of coming to a strange city not knowing any members of AA. Dr. Bob, however, informed Arnie that there were four alcoholics receiving therapy sessions using the Big Book of AA.

Upon moving to 358 Davidson in the Kensington area, Arnie proceeded to go to this doctor's office. He was greeted by a nurse in a white uniform who took down his name, address, who referred him, and so on. He acted as though he knew nothing about Alcoholics Anonymous. But he did have the name of Bob C., (whose wife wrote Central Office in New York,) and in his car, parked out in front, he had a copy of the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Arnie was charged \$5, because it was to be his first visit. At this particular session he attended he found eight people, six men and two women. And he immediately spotted Bob C. from the description provided him by Dr. Bob. That night Dr. Sam Y. discussed Chapter Five of the Big Book, never once displaying the book, for he had memorized the chapters word for word. He started, "Rarely have we seen a person fail who has thoroughly followed our path..."

THE STEPS



1. We admitted we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable.
2. Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
3. Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God, as we understand Him.
4. Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
5. Admitted to God, to ourselves and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
6. Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
7. Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
8. Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
9. Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
10. Continued to take personal inventory, and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
11. Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God, as we understand Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
12. Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

After the session was over, Arnie met with Bob C. and disclosed that he had been sent by the co-founder of AA. He asked Bob C. to contact the other members of the group who had attended this therapy session who had written into New York for help. Arnie suggested they all would meet up at the corner to talk. They got into Arnie's car and Arnie told them the story of Bob C.'s wife's letter accusing AA of being a fraud. Under a street light, Arnie pulled out the Big Book and read the rest of Chapter Five to the group assembled. Arnie then took the four men to his home. That was on April 8th, 1941. In his kitchen on 358 Davidson St., upstairs on the second floor, the first meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous, as we know it today, was held.

Seven years later, it was learned by a member of AA from the director of Family Services Society that Dr. Sam Y. was paid a handsome fee by them, and under no circumstances was he to charge the alcoholics under his services for their care. But after the first meeting on April 8th, 1941, no more meetings were conducted by Dr. Y.

Weekly meetings were held in Arnie's home until it became impossible to deal with the large numbers of people seeking help. Any letters sent to New York were no longer forwarded to the Family Services Society, but were sent to a Post Office Box C, Kensington, a post office box number close to Arnie's home.

AA decided to move into larger quarters, to a church somewhere on West Ferry St. But that was during wintertime when the weather was cold. In April or May of 1942, the meeting moved again to 299 Highland Avenue, the home of a member of AA, who was an undertaker.
